2 Aims & Markers

Inviting

- By personal invitation and advertising through newsletter, social media, banners involve more people in the life of the church and community centre.
 - > Eg By end 2025 have 10 new regular worshippers in church
 - eg by end on 2024 have created a new regular social opportunity
 - > eg by end of 2023 have increased community use by 10%
- Invite congregation and community users to be involved in a social justice campaign
 - > eg by end on 2023 involve Peace and Justice group in action
 - > eg by end of 2024 be more aware of commitment to racial justice

Invoking,

- We will provide opportunities for prayer
 - >> Produce a monthly prayer calendar
 - Meet at least once a week maintaining a list of regular prayer topics (currently Thursday am)
 - > Include prayer as part of all our decision making process
 - > Aspire to another prayerful activity
- We will be active in creating opportunities for prayerful action
 - > We will continue to support refugee communities
 - > We will be engaged in food and fuel poverty issues
 - > By end 2023 we will be a silver eco church

Investing

- We will provide safe spaces for loving action to be enjoyed
 - > Support Ukrainian language classes
 - By end 2024 have conducted a same sex marriage and created opportunities for LGBT+ groups to meet together
 - > A combination of paying and free user groups will maintain a sustainable community space for benefit of community
 - > We will continue to encourage the use of Fairtrade products amongst our membership and maintain a Fairtrade stall

Including

- We will build a community that seeks to welcome all God's people with a particular bias towards the poor, marginalised and commonly excluded
 - > We pledge to work to remove racism, not only from our communities and places of work, but also from our hearts and minds.
 - > We will be a place where LGBTQ+ can explore their faith without fear of exclusion or conversion
 - > We will develop outreach to 20-50 years olds seeking to develop faith alongside social justice
 - > We will hold six social events per year and explore new ways of gathering together.

Involving

- We will create opportunities for the whole church community to develop the mission of the church
 - > We will continue to hold 5 Church Meetings per year, an annual Church Away day and inform via Link newsletter
 - > We will continue to hold 10 Elders'/Trustee Meetings a year and an Elders away day each year
 - > By end of 2024 we will develop a Building users group to share our common life together.
- We will seek ways to listen to the needs of the local community and respond to their promptings
 - > We will engage with local councillors
 - > We will network with community groups
- We will never seek to do alone what we can do together
 - > We will develop our links with Three Churches Partnership
 - > We will work alongside our friends in Loughborough Church Partnership
 - > We will be active participants in Loughborough Faith Network, Town of Sanctuary and Equality Action

Inspiring

- We will maintain a high standard and variety of worship and teaching,
 - > We will celebrate communion once a month
 - > We will support at least two regular bible studies per month and a regular fellowship group
 - > Providing special services for festivals and other occasion
 - > Providing training and opportunities for worship leaders, readers, leaders of intercessions and operation of audio/visual equipment etc at least once a year
 - Offering support for worship leaders, elders, choir members, belle-plate group members, organists, flower arrangers and distributors, those offering transport to services.
- We will Maintain our Mission and Outreach Group to keep our church aware of local, national and international issues and to co-ordinate our work.
- Encourage 3CP Peace and Justice Group to bring issues to the church for action.
