We are pleased to be an Eco-Church and to spend time considering what that means in practice and in theory. It's not always easy to be as Eco-Friendly as we like. We manage an old building that is heated with gas boilers, has an electricity supply that defies the use of the smart meters and can not be insulated to modern building standards. Many of us live lifestyles where being environmentally friendly might involve recycling, but might not make us think about what we eat, or where we buy it, or which is the most environmentally prudent mode of transport rather than the most convenient.

And why bother at all? Well even as I began to write this I glanced at my newsfeed and there was an article telling me that in 2024, 15 national temperature records have been set as all around the world people face the impact of global warming. We have had a very wet year, elsewhere temperatures are reaching dangerous heights in places that used to be habitable. That is creating population pressures as people seek to leave unmanageable regions and relocate into more temperate climates (like ours) and others look to hold on to what they have and create barriers to movement. The temptation for many is to ignore it all and hope that it goes away, or remains manageable in our lifetimes.

But, when we turn to the bible we discover wonderful poems of creation in which God declares, "It is good" and hands the earth's resources to humanity to steward and tend. When we steward such things we do so not just for our own benefit, but to hand something good onto other generations. Sadly, future generations may look at our lifetimes and wonder, "How could they?" So we try lots of little steps, hoping that by all doing so we can make a difference, and new generations can experience a more eco-friendly way of life.

Our services in September will be about Respect; Remembering; Reducing, Reusing, Recycling; Responding; Rejoicing. It will culminate in a Harvest festival and lunch that will encourage us to use our LOAF. That is, sourcing food that is LOCAL and therefore seasonal and reducing the food miles; ORGANIC, respecting the natural ways of growing without pesticides; ANIMAL-FRIENDLY, remembering that livestock are sentient created beings and treating them accordingly; FAIRTRADE, ensuring that everyone in the food production chain gets a fair price for their investment.
